UNIX Gallery – founded in 2003 by Alex Cesaria and Daniela Mercuri – initially specialized in the secondary market in London, After entering the primary contemporary art market with their first US-based gallery in Miami in 2008, they soon expanded in 2013 with a second location at West 24th Street in New York City. The New York space quickly became the flagship location for the rising business.

The gallery stimulates the careers of artists with compelling, unique visions who utilize exquisite artistic execution. It represents an international group of established and emerging artists who embrace a ranging spectrum of traditional and contemporary artistic practices from painting, sculpture, and photography, to large-scale installations and a synthesis of diverse mediums.
